Summary of Site Work Planned for 2023

Work Planned for 2023: Perform semi-annual groundwater monitoring, data evaluation and reporting. Prepare for and participate in up to three (3) public meetings and redevelopment sessions. Prepare various public communications (i.e., multiple fact sheets, flyers, presentations, public notices, etc.) and maintain the Site-specific website, including website hosting fees, Participate in various meetings with stakeholders (City of Bossier City, NAACP, and various residents). Continue to perform outreach to community stakeholders (including the Bossier City NAACP chapter, various residents, Shreveport-Bossier City African American Chamber of Commerce and local churches to support the local hiring effort and redevelopment planning process for this OFS situated in an Environmental Justice community).

Complete implementation and reporting associated with the LDEQ approved Supplemental Offsite Surface Soil Sampling Work Plan to address resident concerns regarding historical flooding. Complete remaining Offsite Residential Surface Soil Interim Action construction activities. Upon LDEQ-approval of the Addendum to the Offsite Residential Surface Soil Interim Action Work Plan, remove contaminated soils from beneath the Housing Authority of Bossier City parking lot and restore the parking lot. Prepare a construction completion report summarizing the Offsite Residential Surface Soil Interim Action construction activities, including but not limited to excavation, restoration, confirmation sampling, and air monitoring activities. Begin preparation of the Corrective Action Study for the Site by evaluating options for the ditches along the railroad (update the identification and screening of potential remedial alternatives for the Site AOIs that exceed the LDEQ Risk Evaluation / Corrective Action Program (RECAP) standards for groundwater, subsurface soil, and onsite surface soil). Support preparation of the Multistate Trust's 2022 Annual Progress Report (portion specific to the Site).

ork Planned with Amendment No. 1: On September 18, 2023 the Multistate Trust was notified that clean aggregate placed in the northeast corner of the southern portion of the HABC parking lot was stained black and contained creosote/petroleum hydrocarbon-like odors. determine the cause of staining, the Multistate Trust's third-party contractor removed the impacted aggregate and performed a "hot spot" removal. A timber and other wood fragments saturated with oil (presumably creosote) were encountered between 3 to 4.5 feet low the original ground surface. Because this new information changes the Multistate Trust's understanding of the conceptual site model, a vapor intrusion (VI) investigation is warranted to evaluate the VI pathway at certain buildings adjacent to or potentially on top of the storical ditch. This amendment includes a total of \$209,000 to (i) prepare a VI Investigation Work Plan, including subslab soil gas-, indoor air-, and outdoor air-sample collection, for LDEQ review and approval, (ii) procure the necessary equipment and subcontractors to begin eld work in late-January/early-February 2024, and (iii) support VI-specific community engagement. To offset these costs, this amendment (i) removes the Corrective Action Study for the Site from the 2023 ECA budget (\$99,000) because this activity has been postponed until 224 due to the ongoing Offsite Residential Surface Soil Interim Action construction activities and additional soil sampling activities and (ii) reduced the costs for Offsite Residential Surface Soil Interim Action construction activities based on estimated costs at completion
