Work Completed in 2022: Continued post-closure care of closed hazardous waste impoundment; performed site security and routine maintenance activities; submitted 2021 groundwater monitoring compliance report\*; submitted revised Baseline Ecological Risk Assessment (BERA) report to EPA and MDEQ for review and approval; prepared and submitted draft Corrective Measures Study (CMS) report for the Site to EPA and MDEQ for review and comment; project management and regular communication with EPA and MDEQ. \*Class II Permit Modification request was approved by MDEQ to suspend the groundwater monitoring and sampling requirements going forward.

Work Planned for 2023: Continue post-closure care of closed hazardous waste impoundment; perform site security and routine maintenance; finalize CMS report with EPA and MDEQ approval; limited groundwater monitoring activities to gauge non-aqueous phase liquid (NAPL) present in Site monitoring wells; waste disposal; preliminary design investigation activities including a topographic survey, a bathymetric stream survey of Sowashee Creek, and geotechnical evaluation of the Sowashee Creek bank area; preliminary design evaluations to support grading and drainage planning, a streambank stabilization assessment, wetland mitigation planning, and permit planning; project management and regular communication with EPA and MDEQ; and community outreach, Site reuse and redevelopment initiatives.
