Summary of Site Work Completed in 2022 and Planned for 2023:

Work Completed in 2022: Performed WP-6 groundwater compliance monitoring, cap monitoring and associated reporting. Completed routine caretaking activities, including Site mowing, maintenance and repairs to the perimeter fence, Site building and equipment. Performed initial repairs to Site building to address damage caused by vandals in late 2021 and evaluated both future building and Site security needs to assess costs for additional uture maintenance and security. Prepared the Groundwater Characterization Report and submitted to DEQ on January 31, 2022. Prepared the Groundwater Feasibility Study (FS) Work Plan and submitted to DEQ for review a approval on April 29, 2022. Received DEQ comments on the Groundwater FS Work Plan and incorporated responses to DEQ's comments into the Final Groundwater FS Work Plan. Evaluated sheen observations from Cedar Creek, the West Tributary and the East Tributary. Prepared a Sheen Response Plan for responding to sheens observed in Cedar Creek, the West Tributary and the East Tributary. The Sheen Response Plan was submitted to DEQ as an attachment to the Groundwater FS WP. Performed routine surface water inspections and responded to sheen observations in accordance with Sheen Response Plan, Upon DEQ conditional approval of the Groundwater F. Work Plan, the Multistate Trust's third-party contractor(s) developed scopes of work and associated costs to implement the Groundwater FS Work Plan, Prepared the Surface Soil Sampling Work Plan for the "City Lot". Engaged in reuse and redevelopment communications with the City of Cleveland leaders. Supported preparation of Chapter 3.U (specific to the Site) of the Multistate Trust 2021 Annual Progress Report.

Work Planned for 2023: Continue WP-6 compliance monitoring and maintenance, Site mowing and maintenance, including perimeter fence and Site building and equipment. Perform additional repairs to Site building as needed. Implement groundwater feasibility study work plan. Complete City lot sampling and prepare recommendations for reuse. Continue to engage with City leaders on reuse/redevelopment ideas. Perform WP-6 groundwater compliance monitoring, cap monitoring and associated reporting. Complete routine caretaking activities, including Site mowing and maintenance. Perform additional repairs to Site building as necessary. Perform outine surface water inspections and respond to sheen observations in Cedar Creek, the West Tributary and the Eastin accordance with Sheen Response Plan. Implement the Groundwater FS Work Plan and associated field nvestigation activities. Update the CSM based on the findings of the Groundwater FS investigation activities, development the remedial action objectives (RAOs), support the preparation of the Proposed Plan and Decision Document, and support public meeting outreach, including fact sheets, meeting materials and meeting participation. Finalize and submit the Surface Soil Sampling Work Plan for the "City Lot" for review, comment and approve by DEQ. Implement surface soil sampling field activities and prepare a report to document the findings and recommendations. Continue discussions with the City of Cleveland to integrate cleanup plans with future potential euse options and considerations, as appropriate. Support preparation of the Multistate Trust 2022 Annual Progress Report (portion specific to the Site).
